Introduction:

- 1. The issue of modesty, like all other moral issues can be settled if we possess the attitude of (Matthew 6:10).

I. Modesty Can be a Problem Among God's People

- A. It's an unspoken problem, but it is not hidden. We all see it.
- B. The silence may be due to cowardice, or sensitivity, but we must overcome both.
- C. Ills. (1837) Hans Christian Anderson "The Emperor's New Clothes."
- D. The intent of this lesson is to verbalize what we have all been thinking to ourselves but have been reluctant to say out loud.
- E. It's time we stop pretending and speak aloud.

- A. "Culture is religion Externalized" Henry Van Til, former professor of Bible at Calvin College
- B. "Dress is religion externalized."
- C. The way people dress reveals much about their character and what they value.
 - 1. Dress for success (Matthew 11:8).
 - 2. Dress makes a religious statement (2 Samuel 3:31; 11:8).
 - 3. Dress makes a moral statement (Proverbs 7:10).
- D. What message is your dress conveying?
 - 1. Success? Religion? Morality? Rebellion? Sexuality?
 - 2. Your actions speak louder than your words.

III. What Does The Bible Say About Modesty

- A. We have forgotten the fundamental purpose of clothing to cover and hide our nakedness (Genesis 3:21).
- B. (1 Timothy 2:9,10).
- C. You can't dress like that and be cool and fit in?
 - 1. Since when did we get the notion we must fit in?
 - 2. Paul begged us to be different from the world (Romans 12:2).
 - 3. Are we really so shallow and undisciplined that we're more concerned about the world thinks than our Lord?
