What Made Jesus Weep?

(John 11:35)

Introduction: 1. As I have grown older, I've also grown more emotional. I don't know if that is a weakening of my constitution, or if it is a strengthening of my compassion. Maybe a bit of both.

- 2. As you may know, the shortest verse in the English Bible is John 11:35 "Jesus Wept."
- 3. Apart from John 11:35, there are two other instances in Scripture where it is recorded that Jesus cried.
- 4. Let's examine these passages and learn more about Jesus, and hopefully challenge yourself to be more like him.

I. The Death of Lazarus

- A. (John 11:35).
- B. Jesus was not weeping for the same reason you have wept at the grave of a loved one.
- C. (John 11:11).
- D. Jesus was weeping, not for Lazarus, but for those who were weeping.
- E. (Romans 12:15; 1 Corinthians 15:26; Hebrews 4:15).

II. The Fall of Jerusalem

- A. (Luke 19:41).
- B. Jesus wept because they rejected an opportunity to be saved, and he knew what they would face.
- C. (Hebrews 13:9) Jesus will probably weep as we close out this worship service today for the same reason.
- D. The death of the unrighteous is nothing over which we should rejoice (Ezekiel 33:11).

III. His Impending Death

- A. (Hebrews 5:7).
- B. Don't forget that Jesus was fully human.
- C. If I told you that you would be brutely murdered tomorrow, would you have reason for tears?
 - 1. Loss of family and friends.
 - 2. Pain and fear.
 - 3. All the sins of humanity that put him in this position.
- D. Personal pain, sorrow, and loss did not turn Jesus from obedience to his Heavenly Father.

Conclusion: 1. May God break our hearts and reshape them to be conformed to the heart of Jesus.
