- A. It was realistic.
  - 1. It acknowledged the reality of death
  - 2. (Psalm 90:10).
- B. It was informed.
  - 1. Many people know that death is coming but fail to see the difference between the death of a righteous man and the death of a sinner.
  - 2. (Hebrews 9:27; Matthew 10:28).
  - 3. Any informed person would want to die the death of the righteous.
- C. It expressed the most important concern a person can have.
  - 1. We often ask for many things, but none more important than this.
  - 2. (John 8:21).
  - 3. (Mark 8:36-37).

### II. Why This Common Prayer Is Often Futile

- A. (Numbers 22-24; 31:16).
- B. Because most people have the desire to be saved, but not the determination (Matthew 19:16-26).
- C. Because most people want what God can give them but want what the world has to offer more (Matthew 6:24).
- D. Because most people want to be numbered with the righteous in death but choose to be numbered with the sinners in life (2 Corinthians 6:14-18).
- E. Because people will pray for themselves while causing others to be lost (Numbers 31:16; Romans 14:7; Luke 17:1-2).
