The Grace of God

(Ephesians 2:1-22)

- Introduction: 1. Jesus, Jesus, Jesus, sweetest name I know. Fills my every longing, keeps me singing as I go.
 - 2. There are few passages that address the importance of Jesus than Ephesians 1.
 - 3. Twelve times in Ephesians 1, we are told of blessings that are ours because we are "in Him." (Chosen, redeemed, gathered, heirs, predestined, sealed, etc.).
 - 4. But Ephesians 2 picks up where he left off and tells us how much more we are blessed by being in Christ.
 - 5. In doing so, he uses a pattern...
 - a. What we were.
 - b. What God did.
 - c. What we are now.

I. God's Grace Raised Us to Reign (Ephesians 2:1-10)

- A. What We Were (Ephesians 2:1-3).
 - 1. Dead in trespasses (Ephesians 2:1).
 - 2. Children of wrath (Ephesians 2:3).
- B. What God Did (Ephesians 2:4-9).
 - 1. But God... (Ephesians 2:4).
 - 2. Made us alive with Christ and raised us up to sit in heavenly places in Christ (Ephesians 2:4-6).
 - 3. Saved us (Ephesians 2:8).
- C. What We Are Now (Ephesians 2:10).
 - 1. His workmanship (Ephesians 2:10).

II. God's Grace Reconciled Us to Worship (Ephesians 2:11-22)

- A. What we were (Ephesians 2:11-12).
 - 1. Without Christ, without God, and having no hope (Ephesians 2:11-12).
- B. What God did (Ephesians 2:13-17).
 - 1. But now in Christ... (Ephesians 2:13).
 - 2. We were brought near and reconciled by the blood/cross of Jesus (Ephesians 2:14-16).
- C. What we are now (Ephesians 2:18-22).
 - 1. Fellow citizens and members of the household (Ephesians 2:19).
 - 2. Part of a spiritual temple for a dwelling place of God (Ephesians 2:20-22).
- Conclusion: 1. What more can be said than Paul said at this time of invitation?
 - 2. In Christ, there is hope; outside of Christ, there is only hopelessness.
 - 3. Why flirt with disaster any longer?
