Was Jesus "Woke?"

(Mark 7:24-30)

Introduction: 1. From time to time, you may hear someone affirm that Jesus was "woke."

- Some even say that Jesus didn't start out that way, but was prejudiced, and used racial slurs until one day he was shamed and embarrassed by a Syro-Phoenician woman. It was at that moment, Jesus "Woke" up.
- 3. Such a view of Jesus is absolutely untenable in light of the fact that he was God in the flesh.
- 4. So, in this lesson, I want to define what it means to be "Woke," and answer the question, "Was Jesus Woke?"

I. What Is Wokeness?

- A. The concept of being "woke" means to be alert to injustice and discrimination in society, especially racism.
- B. However, in our culture, what it really means is being "awakened" to the issues of the day such as, LGBTQ rights, abortion rights, same-sex marriage, sexual freedom, gender fluidity, CRT, etc.

II. Was Jesus Woke?

- A. While Jesus was all about equality and extinguishing injustice, he was not "woke" by the way our culture defines it.
- B. Let's consider the evidences.
 - 1. (Matthew 5:44).
 - a. The "Woke Culture" does not love their enemies, they "cancel" their enemies.
 - 2. (John 14:6).
 - a. Jesus is "The Way," "The Truth," and "The Life."
 - b. No "your truth," "my truth," "their truth."
 - c. Jesus claims exclusivity.
 - 3. (1 Corinthians 6:9).
 - a. Jesus demands moral purity.
 - b. He condemns all forms of sexual expression outside of marriage.
 - 4. (Matthew 19:4-5).
 - a. Jesus defined marriage as a bond between one man and one woman.
 - b. Thus, he excluded homosexual relationships.
- Conclusion: 1. While Jesus was all about equality and extinguishing injustice, he would have been canceled by those woke adherents who claim to believe in equality and stamping out injustice.
 - 2. Likewise, if you are a disciple of Jesus, you may be canceled too.
 - 3. Be willing to suffer with him (Philippians 1:29).
