What Will You Do with Jesus?

(Matthew 27:22)

Introduction: 1. Pontius Pilate was the fifth Roman Procurator who ruled over Judea from 26 to 36 A.D.

- 2. As we know, Pilate was the man who had to make a decision about the fate of Jesus.
- 3. This lesson will examine Pilate's fateful decision as well as our own.

I. What Pilate Did with Jesus

- A. (Matthew 27:1-26),
- B. Following the Jewish trial of Jesus, the chief priests brought Jesus to Pilate.
- C. Pilate found no fault in him and passed him off to Herod (Luke 23:6-7).
- D. Herod mocked Jesus and returned him to Pilate (Luke 23:11-12).
- E. Pilate's wife warned him to have nothing to do with Jesus (Matthew 27:19).
- F. Pilate wanted to set Jesus free and offered a prisoner release (Luke 23:22-25).
- G. He ended up asking the question, "What then shall I do with Jesus who is called the Christ?" (Matthew 27:22).
- H. Pilate symbolically washed his hands and sent Jesus away to be crucified (Matthew 27:24-26).

II. What Will We Do with Jesus?

- A. Some will deny him.
 - 1. (Isaiah 53:3).
 - 2. (John 1:11).
 - 3. (Mark 10:17-22).
- B. Some will delay him.
 - 1. (Acts 25:6).
 - 2. There is no "better" time than now. Christianity is not convenient (Matthew 16:24).
- C. Some will attempt to deceive him.
 - 1. Some think they can obligate and manipulate God with minimal service.
 - 2. (Luke 17:5-10).
 - 3. (Revelation 3:15-16).
 - 4. (Matthew 7:21-23).
- D. Some will devote themselves to him.
 - 1. (Matthew 28:19-20).
 - 2. (Galatians 2:20).
- Conclusion: 1. I have pity upon the soul of Pilate as I consider him standing before the Jesus in judgment.
 - 2. But he will be no more pitiable than many of the people living today, maybe even some hearing me this morning.
