- 2. It wasn't a very popular song, averaging less than 10% appearing in hymnals. However, in the 1980's this song exploded and was included in 50% of songbooks, but today it is back to being included in around 10% of hymnals.
- 3. The tune we are familiar with is actually the least known of three tunes to which it is sung.
- 4. The lyrics of this song are some that I really like, so I thought we would talk about them tonight.
