# **Worship in Song**

## "Into Our Hands the Gospel is Given"

(2 Corinthians 4:7)

#### Introduction: 1.

- Tonight's song is not one that we frequently sing.
- 2. In fact, over the past 3600 songs sung at Karns, we've only sung it three times.
- 3. So, apparently, it's not the most popular song in our song book or any songbook for that matter.
  - a. Ruth Johnson Carruth, a preacher's wife (Roy Carruth) from Texas wrote this song in 1959 and Tillitt S. Teddlie put it to music.
  - b. According to Hymnary, her song was only published in two song books, "Sacred Selection" and a Mennonite song book (That is not an accurate number, but not far off).
  - c. Compared to "Amazing Grace" it is in approximately 1400 song books.
- 4. But the message is a powerful one that reminds us of our obligation to evangelize.

#### I. The Clock is Ticking on Our Lives

- A. Do you remember the parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30).
  - 1. A talent is not a coin, but a weight of currency, approximately 66 75 lbs.
  - 2. Doing nothing is unacceptable.
  - 3. We have to have something to show for our time here on earth.
- B. (2 Corinthians 5:10).
- C. (Ephesians 5:16).
- D. We will reap what we sow (Galatians 6:7-8).
- E. (Luke 12:16-21).
- F. We can't guess when Jesus will return and even if we could, we cannot manipulate God by "cramming for the final exam."

#### II. Lost Without the Gospel

- A. Are people really lost without the gospel? Will people go to Hell who have never even heard of Jesus?
- B. To answer this question, we must first harness our emotions, and allow God's word to speak to the question.
- C. Reasons people are lost without obedience to the gospel.
  - 1. (Romans 1:20).
  - 2. Why are people lost? Not because they've never heard the gospel, but because they sinned. One is the cause, the other is the remedy.
  - 3. (1 Thessalonians 1:7-8).
  - 4. If saved in ignorance, why evangelize?

5. If saved in ignorance, what are we to think of God sending Jesus to the cross?

### III. Our Obligation to the Lost

- A. Every gospel account ends with the great commission (Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:46-47; John 20:21).
- B. 2018 Barna Poll of Church Goers.
  - 1. Have you heard of the great commission?
    - a. 51% had never heard of it.
    - b. 25% had heard of it but didn't know what it was.
    - c. 17% knew what it was.
- C. (Acts 20:26-27).
- D. (2 Corinthians 4:13).

Conclusion: 1. This song should remind us of our accountability to God.

2. It should also remind us of our place in God's scheme of redemption.
