Marks of an Effective Church

(Ephesians 1:22-23)

- Introduction: 1. Churches today face a dilemma that, I suppose, they have always faced.
 - 2. That dilemma is, "How do we maintain our effectiveness, without going beyond Scripture?"
 - 3. I think we have all seen churches that seem more interested in maintaining their comfort zones than in raiding Satan's camp and freeing his captives.
 - 4. On the other hand, we have seen churches that have succumb to the pressures of being relevant to our culture and have compromised God's word for the approval of men.
 - 5. Both of these extremes are wrong, and as usual, the truth is somewhere in the middle of these two extremes.
 - 6. In this lesson, I want to propose what an effective church looks like.
