Introduction: 1. At this time of year, we typically find ourselves making evaluations of ourselves and new commitments.

- 2. This is commendable (2 Corinthians 13:5).
- 3. But as I typically say at the end of the year, "A right relationship with God is not achieved by the turning of a calendar, but by repentance."
 - a. Resolutions without repentance simply make us nicer sinners.
 - b. Also, don't think that the fact that God hasn't "zapped" you is evidence of your good standing with him, rather it is evidence of God's patience.
- 4. This lesson is intended to make us do some self-evaluation.

I. Take Inventory of Your Spiritual Condition

- A. Are you saved or lost?
- B. (Matthew 16:26).
- C. (Acts 2:36-38; 8:12-24).
- D. (Hebrews 10:26-31; Acts 16:33).

II. Take Inventory of Your Spiritual Growth

- A. Bible Knowledge (2 Peter 3:18; 2 Timothy 2:15).
- B. Evangelism (Matthew 28:19-20).
- C. Commitment (Galatians 2:20; Matthew 6:33).

III. Take Inventory of Your Spiritual Goals

- A. Do you have any goals?
- B. We need to set goals that depend on us, not others as to whether we reach them or not.
- C. If we aim at nothing, we'll be sure to hit it.
- D. (Colossians 3:1-2).

Conclusion:

- 1. God has been good to you by giving you life in this new year.
- 2. But as is the truth every year that I have preached for the past 38 years, some of the people listening to me today will not be here at this time next year.
- 3. Please take inventory. Check your priorities. Quite literally, Heaven and Hell hang in the balance.
