 - 5. (Job 23:3) Oh, that I knew where I might find Him.

I. How Do You Keep Yourself From Losing Christ

- A. Don't Take Your Eyes Off Of Him.
 - 1. (Hebrews 12:1-2) Looking unto Jesus.
 - 2. "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in his wonderful face, and the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of his glory and grace."
 - 3. (Matthew 14:29) Peter walking on water.
 - 4. When you have seen the beauty of Jesus, how could you look to another?
- B. Follow Jesus Closely.
 - 1. The command to "follow me" is said by Jesus more than 20 times in the gospel accounts.
 - 2. (Matthew 16:24) deny self, take up cross, follow me.
 - 3. (Matthew 26:58) Peter followed at a distance.
 - 4. You can't follow Jesus at a distance. You'll lose Him if you try.
 - 5. Some people are miserable in life.
 - a. They know too much about Jesus to enjoy sin.
 - b. They sin too much to enjoy Jesus.
 - c. It's all or nothing.
 - 6. (Matthew 13:18-23).
- C. Cleave To Him.
 - 1. (Romans 8:38-39).
 - 2. Don't allow anything to turn you from the Lord.
 - 3. (Acts 11:23) "cleave to the Lord."
 - 4. (Romans 12:9) Abhor evil, cleave to that which is good.

Conclusion:

- 1. Jesus can be found in Scripture. Therein, you can learn of his identity, get to know Him, and fall in love with Him.
- 2. Once you have done that, keep your eyes on him, follow him closely, and never, ever let go of His hand.
