 - f. Lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, and the pride of life (3:6; 1 John 2:15-16).
- B. The People of Noah's Day (Genesis 6; 2 Peter 2:5).
- C. The Thief on the Cross (Luke 23:39-41).
- D. Felix (Acts 24:24-25).

II. Opportunities We Cannot Afford To Lose.

 - 1. (Ephesians 6:4).
 - 2. (Genesis 12:8; Genesis 22).
 - 3. (1 Samuel 3:13; 2:22-24) Eli.
- B. Serve the Lord.
 - 1. (Mark 9:1; Galatians 6:10).
 - 2. How many people can be changed by kindness and goodness (Romans 2:4).
- C. Speak for the Lord.
 - 1. (2 Kings 7:9).
 - 2. (Isaiah 6:1-9).
