Introduction:

- 1. One of the most irrational thoughts humans entertain is, "Does God really care about me?"
- 2. God's grace stands as a monument answering that question.
 - a. God's grace transcends time.
 - b. God's grace is given in abundance.
- 3. In this lesson, let us attempt to gain a greater appreciation of the grace of God which surpasses knowledge.

I. The Grace Of God Is Likened Unto...

- A. A Self Sacrifice (John 10:18; Matthew 20:28).
- B. An Offer Of Forgiveness (Romans 4:7-8; Ephesians 1:7).
- C. A Sacrifice Of A Son (John 3:16; 2 Corinthians 5:21).

II. The Reality Of God's Grace Is Even Greater

- A. It was a self sacrifice, but it was more than that.
- B. It was an offer of forgiveness, but it was more than that.
- C. It was a sacrifice of a son, but it was more than that.
- D. Jesus didn't just die for friends, unelightened misguided people, or strangers, He died for his enemies!
- E. (Romans 5:6-10).

III. Angry With God's Grace?

- A. (Jonah 4:2) Many are so preoccupied with the "Great Fish" that they miss the "Great God."
- B. (Matthew 20:1-16) The laborers were angry with grace.
- C. (Luke 15) The elder son was angry with grace.

IV. How God Dispenses His Grace

- A. God's grace is given unconditionally (Titus 2:10-11), and received conditionally (2 Corinthians 6:1).
- B. Salvation is a gift that has conditions (Acts 2:22-47).

Conclusion:

- 1. God loves you. That question was settled at the cross.
- 2. Whether or not you love God may be an issue that needs to be settled.
- 3. Why not settle that question today through faith and obedience to God's commands.
