I. In The Manger...

- A. Jesus was helpless, but as a man, he was all-powerful (Matthew 28:19-20).
- B. Jesus was loved, but as a man, he was hated (John 3:19).
- C. Jesus made demands of his mother, but as a man, he makes demands of everyone (Luke 13:3).

 - 2. (Mark 10:17-27) The Rich Young Ruler
 - a. Jesus loved the man, but allowed him to walk away.
 - b. No compromise was offered.
