- B. 300 years later, Josiah comes to power at the age of 8.
- C. By the age of 16, he began to bring reform and fulfill the prophecies (2 Chronicles 34:3-5).
- D. Josiah began to rebuild and restore the temple that had been neglected.
- E. During this time, Hilkiah, a priest, found the book of the law in the house of the Lord (2 Chronicles 34:14).
- F. Josiah was then enlightened, repented, and began to reinstate the religion that had been neglected for over 57 years (55- Manasseh; 2 Amon).
