# The Challenge To See God:

Elijah In The Presence Of God (1 Kings 19:1-10)

#### Introduction:

- 1. Ills. of woman who has electricity, but only uses it to light her candles. Point: We have resources that we may not use.
- 2. Acknowledging the presence of God is one of the greatest strengths we have as we attempt to live successful Christian lives.
- 3. Let's examine how acknowledging God's presence will help us in our lives.

# I. Background To Elijah & His Situation

- A. Elijah has been a hunted man (1 Kings 18:10-12).
- B. Elijah is accused of being a trouble-maker (1 Kings 18:17).
- C. Elijah stands alone against the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:21).
- D. When Jezebel hears what Elijah had done, she vows to kill Elijah (1 Kings 19:2).
- E. Elijah flees, feeling alone and abandoned, and asks to die (1 Kings 19:4,10).
- F. Questions concerning Elijah.
  - 1. How had God demonstrated his presence to Elijah?
    - a. Causing no rain, providing food, giving miraculous abilities, victory at Mt. Carmel.
  - 2. How then can Elijah say he is all alone?
  - 3. Shouldn't we be willing to serve God for nothing?

### II. Consider Several Facts About God's Presence

- A. The Focus of His Presence.
  - 1. Don't you think that if Elijah had been focusing upon God's presence, he wouldn't have been so depressed and discouraged?
  - 2. Consider Daniel 3:22-26.
  - 3. The presence of God distracted their attention away from the flames.
  - 4. They focused upon God, and not their circumstances.
  - 5. Note that they didn't run out of the flames, but had to be told to come out of the flames!
- B. The Peace of His Presence.
  - 1. (Romans 8:28).
  - 2. Regardless of what happens in life, God takes notice and promises us it will be okay.
- C. The Promise of His Presence.
  - 1. (Matthew 28:19-20).
  - 2. (John 14:23).
  - 3. Living with a sense of his presence will help us live better lives.
- D. The Presence of God: Threat or Comfort?
  - 1. (Psalm 139).
  - 2. Whether one is threatened or finds comfort in the presence of God depends upon the way he has chosen to live his life.

## Conclusion:

1. While I don't want to minimize the storms of life that you may be facing, I can assure you that however great that storm may be, there is an anchor for your soul - the abiding presence of God.
