Introduction:

- 1. Everyone has some fundamental principles, rules, or ethics by which he chooses to govern his life
- 2. When it comes to the Christian, his code of conduct can be summed up by the single word, "Love."
 - a. (Matthew 22:37-39).
- 3. Upon this rule of love all our obligations and attitudes rest.

I. The Disciples Attitude - With Respect To Judging

- A. (Matthew 7:1-6).
- B. The passage is not forbidding judgment of all sorts because judging is commanded (John 7:24).
- C. It is the hypocritical, self-serving, unrighteous judgment that Jesus condemns in this passage.

II. The Disciples Attitude - With Respect To His Treatment of Others

- A. (Matthew 7:12).
- B. There are many "rules" by which men live.
 - 1. Iron Rule Do unto others before they do unto you.
 - 2. Bronze Rule Do unto others as they do unto you.
 - 3. Silver Rule Do not do unto others what you would not want them to do to you.
 - 4. Golden Rule Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.
- C. If this we lived by this attitude, how would it change our lives with respect to:
 - 1. The Lost in the world?
 - 2. The Wayward?
 - 3. Those who make mistakes?
 - 4. The bereaved?
 - 5. The sick?
 - 6. Accusations made against another?

Conclusion:

- 1. The attitude that is to be possessed by the disciple of Christ is indeed challenging and difficult.
- 2. In fact, it is simply a pursuit of Christ-likeness who acted on behalf of our good even to his own harm.
