 - 4. War is a fact of life. In spite of treaties and world peace organizations, war continues to plague the world.
 - 5. But war also occurs within churches and among Christian people and many causalities occur from "friendly fire."
 - a. Often times, these wars are fought over equally insignificant matters.
 - 5. What can we do to to bring an end to these frivolous wars.
