How To Become A Christian?

(Acts 16:25-34)

- Introduction: 1. If the Devil's goal is to keep one from going to heaven, then it should be no surprise that there would be confusion over how to become a Christian.
 - 2. Such confusion exists today.
 - 3. In this lesson, we wish to look at what the Bible says one must do in order to become a Christian.

I. Definition Of A Christian

- A. Many define the term "Christian" by several misleading definitions.
- B. Some say "Christian" means to be "like Christ."
- C. Others say that "Christian" means to be a "follower of Christ."
- D. However, a more accurate definition of a Christian is "one who belongs to Christ."

II. How Does One Become A Christian Or Come To Belong To Christ?

- A. (Acts 2) Day of Pentecost.
- B. (Acts 8:1-13) Philip & Samaria.
- C. (Acts 8:26-40) Ethiopian Eunuch.
- D. (Acts 9:1-19; Acts 22:16) Saul.
- E. (Acts 16:11-15) Lydia.
- F. (Acts 16:16-34) Philippian Jailer.

Conclusion: 1. While all the details are not expressly stated in each account, without exception, every account ends with one being baptized.

- 2. This is the line of demarcation between one who is a casual follower of Jesus and one who can rightfully wear his name, belonging to him.
- 3. (1 Corinthians 1:10-13).
 - a. Unless one was baptized in the name of Paul, he cannot say he is "of Paul."
 - b. Unless one is baptized in the name of Christ, he cannot rightfully say he is "of Christ" (i.e. a Christian).
