Introduction: 1. Few have has as much said about them when so little was written as has been the case with the thief on the cross.

- 2. While there is not much said about the thief, there are several lessons we can learn from him.
- 3. Let's examine some of those lessons.

# I. The Thief Had A Change Of Heart

- A. (Matthew 27:44) Both thieves railed on Jesus.
- B. (Luke 23) One thief had a change of heart during the six hours on the cross that day.
- C. In order for anyone to be saved today, they must do as the thief did...undergo a change of heart (Acts 3:19).

# II. Jesus Was Merciful And Gracious

- A. (Luke 23:43).
- B. There was no grudge, only acceptance.
- C. (2 Peter 3:9) God is not willing that any should perish.
- D. (Luke 17:7-10) We are unprofitable servants.
- E. (Romans 5:15) Salvation is a gift.

### III. Perfect Knowledge Is Not Essential For Salvation

- A. (Luke 23:42).
- B. (Acts 1:6).
