(Luke 21:19)

Introduction:

- 1. Patience is one of the Christian virtues, that if we posses, we will never stumble (2 Pet. 1:5-11).
- 2. Thus, if one wishes to go to Heaven, the possession and development of these characteristics must be paramount.

I. The Definition Of Patience

- A. When people today think of patience, they think of bearing up under trials or hardships *without complaint*.
- B. However, patience may be better defined as endurance, and perseverance and not so much "quietly enduring" or enduring without patience.
- C. So the idea of patience is that of endurance, never giving up, perseverance.

 - 2. (1 Peter 3:7) Husbands, likewise, dwell with them with understanding, giving honor to the wife, as to the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life, that your prayers may not be hindered.

- C. We need patience between parents and children.
 - 1. (Ephesians 6:1-4; Colossians 3:21).
 - 4. Be patient, but patience does not stand in opposition to discipline.
 - 5. Children also need to understand and be patient with their parents.
- D. We need to be patient in soul-winning.
 - 1. (1 Peter 3:1-4).
 - 2. (2 Peter 2:5) Noah.
 - 3. (2 Timothy 4:2) We are to teach with all longsuffering.
- E. We must be patient in church growth.
 - 1. The mission of the church is to glorify Christ (Eph. 3:21).
 - 2. Growth is out of our hands, faithfulness is our concern (2 Cor. 4:2).
- F. We need to be patient regarding the coming of the Lord.
 - 1. Jesus is coming back (Acts 1:11).
 - 2. (2 Peter 3:4,9).
