Introduction: 1. One of the messages seen in Scripture is that God can use ordinary people to accomplish extra-ordinary results.

2. The challenge we face is to value our "ordinary talents" and our "ordinary lives" and see beyond the ordinary and see the "extra-ordinary" ways in which God can use us to accomplish his purposes.

I. Biblical Examples Of Using The Ordinary

- A. (Exodus 4:2) Moses and his rod.
 - 1. Consider how God used a simple shepherds rod to do so many great things.
 - a. Turned into a snake (Exodus 4:3).
 - b. Turned the Nile to blood & several other plagues (Exodus 7:20).
 - c. Parted the Red Sea (Exodus 14:16).
 - d. Bring water to drink (Exodus 17:6).
 - e. Won a battle for Israel (Exodus 17:9-14).
- B. (Judges 15:15-17) Samson and a jawbone of a donkey.
 - 1. With this Jawbone, Samson killed 1000 Philistines.
- C. (1 Samuel 17:40) David and a sling.
 - 1. With this sling, David killed the giant, Goliath.
- D. (1 Kings 17:9-16) Widow of Zarephath.
 - 1. The flour and oil that this widow had kept replenishing itself.
- E. (John 6:9-14) The Lad with 5 loaves and 2 fish.
 - 1. With just five loaves and two fish, five thousand were fed.

- A. (Ecclesiastes 9:10) Whatever your hand finds to do; do it with all your might.
- B. (Colossians 3:23-24).
- C. (1 Corinthians 10:31).
