 - 3. We plan for much lesser things.
 - a. Ills. of our vacation to Florida and travelers checks.
 - b. Ills. of Buzz Aldrin and Lord's Supper on the moon.
 - 4. So what plans have we made?

I. God Has Made Plans

- A. Before there was a sinner, there was a Savior (1 Peter 1:18-20; Revelation 13:8).
- B. Before there was guilt, there was grace (2 Timothy 1:9).
- C. Before there was death, there was eternal life (Titus 1:2).

II. What Plans Have We Made?

- A. Ills. WWDC (World Wide Developers Conference).
- B. (Exodus 18:13-26).
 - 1. He listened to a different opinion (18:17).
 - a. Be open to new ideas.
 - b. View through the eyes of another person.
 - c. Congregational planning day.
 - 2. He selected qualified leaders to work with him (18:21,25).
 - a. Avoid the "good old boy" mentality.
 - b. Get the right person for the right job.
 - 3. He trained them for their task (18:20).
 - a. Frustration is often due to failed expectations and failed expectations are often due to lack of training and communication.
 - 4. He described their responsibilities, specifying what they were and were not to do (18:25,26).
 - 5. The result is that it was good for Moses and all the people (18:23).
- C. (Acts 6:1-7).
 - 1. Every problem should be communicated, heard, and evalutated.
 - a. Even when those problems are communicated properly (6:1).
 - 2. Problems should be given quick attention (5:1-11; 6:2-3).
 - 3. Even the best leaders cannot do everything (6:2,4).
 - 4. The congregation is enlisted to help with the solution (6:3).
 - 5. The church grew (6:7).
- Conclusion: 1. The mission of the church is just too important not to make plans.
 - 2. Let's give the kingdom of God the priority, prayer, and planning it deserves.
