 - 1. Humility.
 - a. (Philippians 2:3-8).
 - b. It's hard to grasp that the Creator of the universe was right there in that manger as an infant.
 - c. If we want to make it to Heaven, we must learn and put into practice the humility of Jesus (Matthew 5:3; James 4:10; Luke 14:11).
 - 2. Dependance.
 - a. As a baby, Jesus' survival was totally dependant upon the care and love of Joseph and Mary.
 - b. Jesus is not asking us to do what he, himself was unwilling to do.
 - c. (1 Timothy 4:10).
 - d. (Jude 21-25).
 - 3. Sympathy.
 - a. (Hebrews 4:14-15).
 - b. "Nobody knows the troubles I've seen..."
 - c. The incarnation of Jesus was the greatest act of sympathy (1 John 3:17; 2 Corinthians 8:9).
