Moral Issues: Adultery

(Hebrews 13:4)

- Introduction: 1. Ills. A number of years ago Country Music singer, Randy Travis, sang a song called, "Reasons I Cheat." Here are some of the lyrics of that song: "A wife too demanding, with no understanding of why I stay dead on my feet. A dimly lit tavern, a willing young woman are some of the reasons I cheat. A lady that knows me, affection she shows me and a smile so easy and sweet, are some of the reasons I cheat.
 - 2. Lest someone think I'm picking on Country music, a number of years ago, Paul Simon offered 50 ways to leave a relationship.
 - 3. Within the past decade, surveys have revealed that over 30% of marriages have had to deal with the sin of adultery.
 - 4. We have become desensitized to adultery.
 - a. It's portrayed in the songs we sing.
 - b. It's acted out on television and in the movies.
 - c. We don't seem to mind that our nation's leaders commit it.
 - 5. Let's take a look at what God's word says about adultery and how we can keep ourselves from it.

I. What God Says About Adultery

- A. Under the Old Testament Law, adulterers were to be put to death (Leviticus 20:10).
- B. Jesus forbids adultery (Matthew 5:27-28).
- C. The penalty for adultery under the law of Christ (1 Corinthians 6:9; Galatians 5:19-21; Hebrews 13:4).

II. The Deception of Adultery

- A. Adultery is full of empty promises: It promises pleasure, love, and fulfillment, but in the end it gives pain, suffering, and destruction.
- B. Adultery involves flattery and beauty which leads to destruction (Proverbs 5:1-18; 6:25-26; 7:16-23).
- C. The cost is greater than the benefit.
 - 1. Destroy a marriage, betray a spouse, hurt those you love, destroy another family all for a pursuit of a selfish fantasy.

III. How To Overcome Adultery

- A. Control your heart
 - 1. (Proverbs 4:23).
 - 2. (Matthew 5:28-29).
 - (Proverbs 23:7).
- B. Don't Start Something, or Flirt With Someone Other Than Your Spouse.

- 1. Heed the advice of Paul (1 Timothy 5:1-2).
- 2. (1 Corinthians 15:33).
- 3. Adultery is not a sin we suddenly stumble into, but rather the result of a progression of bad choices.
- 4. Listen to your spouse's advice.
- C. Don't Spend Time Alone With The Opposite Sex.
 - 1. You would be surprised at how much adultery has sprung out of relationships established on the premise of "giving spiritual help."
 - 2. We warn our kids about being alone...it needs to apply to us as well.
 - 3. (Matthew 6:13).
 - 4. Emotional attachments with the opposite sex, which rival or surpass the attachment you have with your spouse are very dangerous.
- D. Find Love and Satisfaction at home with your own spouse.
 - 1. It has often been said that a good defense is a good offense. This can be true in the marriage relationship as well.

 - 3. (Proverbs 5:15-20).
- E. Remember That You Will Get Caught.
 - 1. God always sees (Hebrews 4:13; Ecclesiastes 12:14; Number 32:23).
 - 2. In the mast majority of cases, you will be found out by your friends, your family, your children, your fellow Christians.
- F. Remember That The Way Of The Transgressor Is Hard
 - 1. (Proverbs 13:15).
 - 2. Is it worth it?
 - 3. (Matthew 16:26).

- 1. To those who have suffered through the betrayal of adultery, you know all too well how devastating this sin can be.
- 2. Adultery is one of those terrible sins whose pain and destruction strike twice. It has severe consequences both now and in eternity (Galatians 5:19-21).
