- Introduction: 1. The phrase "total commitment" received a black eye several years ago by some cultic practices by some brethren who were calling people to total commitment.
 - 2. While the controlling, cultic practices of some who were calling for total commitment needed to be discarded, their plea for total commitment needs to be embraced.
 - 3. Our commitment to Christ must run deep because there are too many stresses, trials, disappointments, and hurts in this life.
 - 4. Without total commitment, we'll just walk away when things get too difficult.
 - 5. This lesson is intended to motivate us to develop a deeper commitment to Christ.
