Introduction: 1. (Isaiah 28:20) provides a vivid description of inadequacy.

- 3. This lesson is intended to remind us how to cover our sins, and to trust in the adequacy of that covering.

- D. Trying to ignore our sins.
 - 1. Time has no forgiving power.
 - 2. (Psalm 32:5; 1 John 1:9).
- E. Despairing when we sin.
 - 1. (Matthew 27:3-5).
 - 2. (Psalm 51:17; Romans 8:26).
- F. Good works.
 - 1. (Titus 3:5).
 - 2. (Luke 17:10).

II. Adequate Covering For Our Sins

- A. Covered by the blood of Christ.
 - 1. The blood of Christ is the satisfaction for our sins (Romans 3:23-26).
 - 2. The blood of Christ can reconcile enemies (Romans 5:6-10).
 - 3. The blood of Christ is adequate for the greatest sinner (Romans 5:20).
- B. How do we appropriate the blood of Christ?
 - 1. (Romans 1:1-6).
 - 2. (1 Corinthians 15:1-3; Romans 6:17-18).
