SUFFICIENCY IN EVANGELISM

(Acts 8:26-40)

- Introduction: 1. As Christians, we must continually examine our lives (II Cor. 13:5).
 - 2. From time to time, we may find areas of inadequacy that need our attention.
 - 3. One of the most fundamental obligations of a Christian is surprisingly neglected by some.
 - 4. Therefore, I would like to suggest several points that may help us become more sufficient in this area of evangelism.

I. THERE IS INSUFFICIENCY IN EVANGELISM

- A. The fact that there are people who are ignorant of God in this world of modern technology that expedites communication is a testimony that there is a need for improvement in this area (I Corinthians 15:34).
- B. (I Corinthians 1:21).
- C. The commission has been given, it is plain, it is important, and yet it is neglected.
- D. There are several reasons for our lack of sufficiency in evangelism.
 - 1. Fear (Revelation 21:8).
 - 2. Ignorance (II Peter 3:18).
 - 3. Bad experience (Matthew 10:14).
 - 4. Discouragement (Galatians 6:9).
 - 5. Indifference (I John 3:14).

II. GUIDELINES FOR GREATER SUFFICIENCY IN EVANGELISM

- A. Put Yourself In The Other Person's Place.
 - 1. Recognize their fate if unconverted (II Thessalonians 1:7-9).
 - 2. Also, recognize that their knowledge may not be as great as yours.
 - 3. Therefore, be plain and simple; this is not the time to impress.
 - a. "Hermeneutical Agnosticism".
 - b. Alexander Campbell.
 - c. "You need to obey the gospel".
 - 4. (I Corinthians 14:19).
- B. Make Yourself Available To People.
 - 1. (Acts 8:27-29).
 - 2. Have you ever noticed with whom Jesus surrounded Himself?
 - 3. (Matthew 9:12).
 - 4. (Luke 19:10).
 - 5. A schedule or lifestyle that does not allow for contact with the needs of the lost needs to be changed.
 - 6. As busy as Jesus was, He always had time for people.

- C. Take The Initiative.
 - 1. (Acts 8:30).
 - 2. We need to approach people, not simply respond to them.
 - 3. The message of the gospel is still "go!" (Mt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15).
- D. Be Tactful.
 - 1. (Acts 8:30-34).
 - 2. We need to be sure that if one is offended, he is offended at the message, and not by the messenger.
 - 3. But "tact" cannot be allowed to stand in the way of "contact".

E. Be Precise.

- 1. (Acts 8:34-35).
- 2. Get to the point, and don't allow yourself to become sidetracked.
- 3. Side issues are often tempting, but refrain.
 - a. (John 4:20-24).
 - b. (John 16:12).
- 4. The primary issues in evangelism are not:
 - 1. What is the mark of the beast?
 - 2. Do you believe in guardian angels?
 - 3. Where did Cain get his wife?
- 5. The primary issue in evangelism is, "What is your relationship with God?"

Conclusion: 1. May God help us all to, in a more adequate way, lift up our eyes and reach out to the harvest of souls round about us (John 4:35).
