Responsible Fatherhood

(Ephesians 6:1-4)

Introduction:

- 1. Ephesians 6:1-2 says as much about parents as it does children.
 - a. Children are commanded to obey.
 - b. However, if a child is to honor his parents a responsibility falls upon the parents to conduct themselves in such a way to enable the child to honor and respect them.
- 2. Fathers have been honored by God when God gave them the position of leadership in the home.
- 3. As leaders of the home, we have the potential to influence generations to come; even long after we are gone.
- 4. Let's spend a few minutes examining the biblical role of fathers and take a look at a couple biblical fathers.

I. Biblical Fatherhood

- A. A father must first be a good husband (Ephesians 5:25-33).
 - 1. Commitment is a must (1 Peter 4:8). [1st year of marriage; Dobson ills.]
 - 2. Honor your wife (1 Peter 3:7; Eph. 5:33).
 - 3. Keep courtship alive (Ephesians 5:29).
 - 4. Practice forgiveness (Ephesians 4:32).
- B. A father must be the head of his home (Ephesians 5:23).
 - 1. Headship is not so much about power, but about responsibility.
 - 2. Biblical rationale for headship.
 - a. The principle of firstborn (1 Tim. 2:13; Col. 1:15-18).
 - b. The principle of source (1 Cor. 11:8; Col. 1:16).
 - c. The principle of naming (Gen. 2:20-23).
 - 3. We are held accountable for the headship and leadership we provide for our families (Genesis 2:9; Romans 5:12).
- C. A father must be a provider for his home (1 Timothy 5:8).
 - 1. If one who will not provide for the physical well-being of his family is worse than an infidel, then what is one who will not provide for the spiritual well-being of his family.
 - 2. (Ephesians 6:4) "Admonition of the Lord"

II Biblical Portraits Of Fathers

- A. Abraham.
 - 1. (Genesis 18:17-19).
 - 2. God had confidence that Abraham could command his children.
 - 3. (Joshua 24:15).
- B. Job.
 - 1. Job was the spiritual leader for his family (Job 1:5).
 - 2. Job had a positive outlook on life (Job 1:21; Philippians 4:11; Col. 3:21).
 - 3. Job was a humble man (Job 42:1-6).
