THE EVIDENCE OF FORGIVENESS

(Mark 16:7)

Introduction: 1. Forgiveness is a central theme within Christianity.

- 2. We have all struggled with trying to extend forgiveness to others, while also laboring to receive it ourselves.
- 3. (Matthew 18:35) Our forgiveness depends on how we forgive.
- 4. This lesson is intended to give us advice that will help us learn to forgive.

I. JESUS AND FORGIVENESS

- A. We have an example of a disciple of Jesus that needed Jesus' forgiveness.
- B. (Mark 14:27-31).
 - 1. Peter boldly stated that he would not forsake Jesus.
 - 2. He declared that he would die rather than deny Jesus.
- C. (Mark 14:66-72).
 - 1. Peter did deny the Lord.
 - 2. Jesus turned and looked at Peter (Luke 22:61).
 - 3. Convicted, guilt ridden, and ashamed, Peter left the presence of Jesus and wept bitterly.
- D. Here is a man who needs forgiveness, and received forgiveness (Acts 2:14).
- E. But what were the steps of his reconciliation? How did Jesus evidence His forgiveness to Peter?

II. THE EVIDENCE OF FORGIVENESS

A. A Desire For The Person Is Made Known.

- 1. (Mark 16:7) "Go tell the disciples, and Peter..."
- 2. No doubt, Peter would not have included himself among the disciples at this time, but the angel's words left no doubt in his mind that he was still wanted.
- 3. When someone needs our forgiveness, do we evidence to them our love and desire for them, or do we leave them wondering?

B. The Person Is Included Socially.

- 1. (John 21:1-14).
 - a. Jesus appeared to His disciples and prepared a meal for them.
 - b. Peter was socially included and invited with the rest of the disciples.
- 2. When someone needs our forgiveness, do we evidence our forgiveness by including them socially?

C. The Difficult Issues Are Discussed Privately.

- 1. (John 21:15-20).
 - a. After eating, Jesus walked alone with Peter, discussing their relationship.
 - b. It is here that things are mended Peter is humbled.
- 2. When someone needs our forgiveness, do we discuss those issues

with the privately?

D. Trust Was Demonstrated By Conferring Responsibility Upon Him.

- 1. (John 21:15-17).
 - a. Feed my sheep.
- 2. Jesus restored Peter's vision and verbalized His belief in his ability to effectively minister.
- 3. When someone needs our forgiveness, do we help restore their vision, helping them to see the good they can perform in God's kingdom?

- 1. Here we have an example of one who forgave, and how his forgiveness was evidenced.
- 2. We would all do well to follow our Lord's example.
