 - 1. Marriage is constituted by male and female.
 - 2. Their relationship is intended by God to last for life.
- D. Alteration of God's original plan
 - 1. During the Old Covenant, divorce was permitted.
 - 2. The reason: the hardness of their hearts.
 - 3. It was never God's ideal "from the beginning it was not so."
- E. Christ's teaching on marriage and divorce (19:9)
 - 1. Whoever puts away his wife and marries another commits adultery.
 - 2. "Commits"-present tense meaning "keeps on committing adultery".
 - 3. One exception (fornication) sexual immorality.
- F. The disciples response (19:10).
- G. Jesus' response to the disciples statement (19:11-12).

II. How Should We Respond To The Divorced

- A. Confront and correct in the spirit of love (Galatians 6:1).
- B. Be compassionate (1 Peter 3:8).
- C. Don't desert the divorced (Philippians 2:4).
- D. Pray for the divorced (1 Thess. 5:17; 1 Peter 3:12).
