- 1. Jesus of Nazareth has been without a doubt, the most influential man in the history of our world.
- 2. Though He lived only 33 years, and was but a carpenter's son, He shook the world.
- 3. Thus, it is appropriate to ask the question, "Who is this man?"
 - a. "Who are you, Lord?" (Acts 9:5).
 - b. "Who is this?" (Luke 5:21).
 - c. "Who is this, about whom I hear such things?" (Luke 9:9).
 - d. "Who are you?" (John 8:25).
 - e. "Who do men say that I am?" (Mark 8:27).
