II. Our Obligation To Invite

- A. It is not within our power to convert people to Jesus (1 Corinthians 3:6-7).
- B. It is however, our obligation to invite people to Jesus who can change them.
- C. (Luke 14:15-24).
 - 1. God is the preparer of the feast.
 - 2. His servants are left with the task of inviting.
 - 3. Initial rejection was not excuse for the servant to stop inviting.
 - 4. There is a sense of urgency about the invitation.
