Characters In The Making

"Jesus: Our Perfect Example (Part Three)" (Colossians 1:24-29)

Introduction: 1. This lesson brings to a close a five month series on character studies.

- 2. And appropriately, we are closing with a study in the life of Jesus, the perfect man.
- 3. If we were to sum up God's will for our lives, it would be that we would be "conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:29).
- 4. The past two weeks, we examined several qualities Jesus possessed in his life...service, mercy, equality, obedience, anger, and the nature of his teaching.
- 5. In this lesson, we will examine three more qualities possessed in the character of Jesus.

I. Our Lives Should Reflect The Prayerful Attitude Of Jesus

- A. (Luke 11:1) For the disciples to ask Jesus to teach them how to pray suggests that they recognized Jesus as one who knew how.
- B. Prayer was not an emotionless, rote memorized, exercise in discipline Jesus believed in prayer (Matthew 7:7-11; Hebrews 5:7).
- C. Jesus prayed for himself, for others, and for things.
- D. We need to believe in prayer and demonstrate our faith through our actions (Ephesians 3:20).
- E. (James 5:16; 1 Thessalonians 5:17).

II. Our Lives Should Reflect Contentment Of Jesus

- A. (Matthew 8:20).
- B. (Isaiah 53:3).
- C. (1 Peter 2:23).
- D. We need to learn contentment and patience (Philippians 4:11; Job 1:22).
- E. Suffering should cause us to rely all the more on God and to desire Heaven more than ever.

III. Our Lives Should Reflect The Mission Of Jesus

- C. How urgent is the mission of Jesus carried on in your life?
- D. (Philippians 1:21).
