(Matthew 25:14-30)

- Introduction: 1. The God we serve is an all-knowing God. He knows the history that was written as well as the history that could have been written.
  - a. (Matthew 12:20-24).
  - 2. God's knowledge of all things and our responsibility to use our talents implies that we will be judged for what we do as well as what we could have done!
  - 3. Let's examine several reasons why people fail to live up to their potential.

## I. Fear

- A. Fear of making a mistake, doing something wrong, saying something wrong.
- B. So we do nothing and think that's right?
- C. (Matthew 25:25).
- D. (Revelation 21:8).
- E. (2 Timothy 1:7).

## II. Self Serving

- A. Being all we can be, requires discipline, hard work, and selflessness.
- B. Some people get too wrapped up into themselves to serve others.
- C. Some are more interested in fun and pleasure than denial and service.
- D. (Hebrews 11:25).
- E. Our rest is yet to come (Hebrews 4:9-11).

## III. Immaturity

- A. People get mad, get their feelings hurt, or get discouraged and refuse to involve themselves in the work of the Lord.
- B. How many times have we heard a child say, "I quit?"
- C. (1 Corinthians 16:13).
- D. (1 Corinthians 13:11).
- Conclusion: 1. Let's look at our lives from this awareness of "what could have been."
  - 2. None of us will ever be "all that we could be" (Luke 17:10).
  - 3. But we can be more of what we should be!
  - 4. Live your life so that you won't be condemned by what you should have been or done.
