## What Our Leaders Need To Possess

(1 Thessalonians 5:12-13)

Introduction: 1. Churches have often floundered due to poor leadership choices.

- 2. It is our desire to have a dynamic leadership at South Green that will lead the church in ways that will strength us, reach out to others, and develop peace and love.
- 3. In order to accomplish these goals, our leaders must possess three essential qualities.

## I. Leadership Choices Based On Appearance

- A. Often churches will take a man who "looks" like a leader and will automatically assume he is qualified to serve as a leader in the church.
- B. How often have elders and deacons been selected on the basis of their secular work, only to find out they have not understanding of what it means to be a leader in the church?
- C. Leadership in the church is not the same as in the world (Matthew 20:28).
- D. (1 Samuel 16:7) Samuel's selection of David.

## II. Three Essential Qualities In Leaders

- A. Leaders Must Be Men Of Heart
  - 1. Saul started out with the right heart (1 Samuel 9).
  - 2. David was said to be a man after God's own heart (1 Samuel 13:14).
  - 3. They desire the work, they have a passion for serving, they see a need and want to meet it (1 Timothy 3:1; 1 Peter 5:2).
  - 4. Without the heart, the actions are empty and can be seen to be such.
- B. Leaders Must Be Men Of Ability
  - 1. (1 Chronicles 11&12).
  - 2. Joab was selected to be the Commander of David's army because he had *already* proven himself.
  - 3. (1 Timothy 3:10).
- C. Leaders Must Be Men Of Direction
  - 1. (1 Chronicles 12:32).
  - 2. Leaders must be "risk-takers," or they will become "care-takers" who will eventually become "under-takers."
  - 3. Culture presents challenges; congregational make-up presents challenges; size presents challenges; and maturity presents challenges.
  - 4. Leaders aren't content with the status-quo; they are idealist who see and believe things can be better.

Conclusion: 1. Pray for our leaders; hold up their hands; and ever be a source of joy for them rather than a source of grief.

2. Hold them accountable, but also be accountable to them.
