- C. Eyes That Will Not See (Romans 11:8-10) Religious error.
  - 1. (Jeremiah 5:31; 6:14).
  - 2. (2 Timothy 4:2-4).

- E. Eyes that fear God (Romans 3:18; Hebrews 10:26-31).
