"Moses: A Type Of Jesus"

(Deuteronomy 18:15-19; Acts 3:22-23)

- Introduction: 1. There are certain events and certain characters in the Old Testament that foreshadow New Testament events and characters.
 - 2. Sometimes this foreshadowing may be considered co-incidental, but sometimes, it is explicitly planned by God in his foreknowledge.
 - 3. Such is the case with Moses and Jesus.
