You Shall Know The Truth, And The Truth Shall Make You... (John 8:32)

Introduction: 1. Jesus declared that He was truth personified (John 14:6).

- a. His words were truth on whatever issues He addressed.
- b. His *behavior* was truth exemplified.
- 2. Because of Jesus' relationship with truth, one would naturally expect truth to be a key issue with His disciples.
- 3. As disciples of Christ, we are to love, seek, and live the truth.
- 4. Why? Because we are purified and sanctified (made holy) by the truth (I Peter 1:22; John 17:17).
- 5. But before the truth makes us free, it often accomplishes other things as well.
- 6. Let us notice what "the truth shall make you...".

I. YOU SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH, BUT THE TRUTH WILL BE HARD FOR YOU TO HEAR

- A. As we encounter truth, we all bring our personal histories, prejudices, and backgrounds that often blind us.
- B. This can be the only explanation of why people do not see the Bible alike without unfavorably reflecting upon the work of God.
- C. (John 6:60,66) Hard sayings caused some to stop following Jesus.
- D. Too often Jesus and the truth He brought are the product of our own construction which distorts the biblical depiction.
 - 1. Jesus was far from unoffensive, He gave offense left and right.
 - 2. Even His followers often found Him disconcerting (Matthew 19:10).
 - 3. He upset many of the established norms of religious propriety.
 - 4. He spoke of God in terms of intimacy which to many sounded like blasphemy.
 - 5. He enjoyed the most questionable company.
- E. (Acts 7:57) "They stopped their ears."
- F. Often Jesus would say, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

II. YOU SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH, BUT THE TRUTH MAY FIRST MAKE YOU MISERABLE

- A. Hearing and receiving the truth requires an honesty and humility that some can never achieve.
- B. It confronts us with our own frailties and limitations.
- C. It demands that we admit we have been wrong.
- D. For some, this confrontation is so painful that they are happier in self deception than in the truth.
- E. (II Thessalonians 2:10-12).

F. (Acts 18:24-19:7) Apollos corrected about baptism.

III. YOU SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH, BUT IT WILL OFTEN BE PAINFUL TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT

- A. We cannot be honest while intellectualizing about the truth, but refusing to practice it.
- B. Truth beckons courageous people who will stand against the current.
- C. (Daniel 3 & 6).

IV. YOU SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH, AND THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

- A. This is the beauty of truth.
- B. For all the difficulty of hearing, accepting, and acting on truth, its value is vindicated in the outcome deliverance!
- C. The humble teachable heart can be set free from sin.
- Conclusion: 1. Truth challenges, truth often hurts, and truth makes tough demands.
 - 2. But if anyone wants to enter into life, truth is the door through which he must pass.
