Two Crosses Necessary To Cross Over

(Matthew 16:24-26)

Introduction: 1. Would it be surprising if I were to say that the cross of Christ is not enough to get you to heaven — that you need another cross?

- 2. Without explanation, that might sound like heresy, but in reality it is the truth.
- 3. We live in a religious atmosphere that claims that everything was accomplished once and for all at the cross.
 - a. We are saved by grace through faith has come across as we are saved by grace without having to do anything.
- 4. This lesson, however is intended to impress upon you our need for works if we are ever to get to heaven.

I. The Cross Of Christ

- A. The cross of Jesus, by itself, is not enough to get anyone to heaven.
- B. If it were, everyone would be saved (Titus 2:10-11).
 - 1. However, some will be lost (Matthew 7:13-14).
- C. Let me hasten to say that the cross of Christ was fully sufficient for its purpose to pave a path to heaven that mankind could choose to walk.
 - 1. The cross of Christ was sufficient to satisfy the debt for sin (2 Cor. 5:21).
 - 2. The cross of Christ was sufficient to buy all men back from sin and condemnation (Titus 2:14).
 - 3. The cross of Christ was sufficient to make salvation available to the whole world (Titus 2:11).
- D. While without the cross of Christ, there would be no salvation, another cross is necessary for salvation to occur.

II. Our Own Cross

- A. Needless to say, bearing our own cross, by itself, is not enough to get us to heaven.
- B. (Matthew 16:24-26).
- C. Salvation comes to us through the divine activity of the cross of Christ **and** through the human agency of bearing our own cross.
- D. Extremes beget extremes and in our effort to make people feel secure, some have crossed over the line.
- E. Note the passages that declare our need for work.
 - 1. (Matthew 7:21-23).
 - 2. (Ephesians 2:8-10).
 - 3. (Philippians 2:12-13).
 - 4. (James 2:24).

Conclusion: 1. The cross of Christ is a settled matter — Jesus did his part.

- 2. In question remains only whether we will pick up our cross and follow Jesus.
- 3. To what degree of commitment have you given to your cross bearing?
