I. A Divorce Dilemma For Jesus

- A. (Matthew 19:1-12).
- B. The Pharisees were testing Jesus (19:3; Deuteronomy 24:1).

II. God's Original Plan

- A. It is to be between male and female (Matthew 19:4).
- B. The couple are to leave father and mother and cleave to each other (Matthew 19:5).
- C. Marriage is to be a union of two lives (Matthew 19:5).
- D. Marriage is to last a lifetime (Matthew 19:6).

III. An Alteration to God's Original Plan

- A. Divorce was tolerated under the Old Law (Matthew 19:6).
- B. This concession, which was less than God's ideal, was tolerated because of the hardness of their hearts (Matthew 19:8).

IV. Jesus' Teaching Regarding Divorce & Remarriage

- A. (Matthew 19:9).
- B. His teaching is contrasted against the tolerance allowed under the Law of Moses.

V. The Reaction of the Disciples

- A. (Matthew 19:10).
- B. They found his teaching difficult and hard to accept.

VI. Jesus' Response To The Disciples Reaction

- A. (Matthew 19:11-12).
- B. In the final analysis, people must bend because God's law doesn't.
- Conclusion: 1. In the midst of a world that flagrantly disobeys God's will in regard to marriage, divorce, and remarriage, we must resolve to stand for what is right, regardless of the cost.
