- C. Since 1973, our Supreme Court has legalized the murder of over 40 million innocent, and defenseless babies.
- D. This Summer, a ban on partial birth abortions was declared unconstitutional by our Supreme Court in a 5-4 decision.
- E. Furthermore, this Fall our nation approved the French abortion pill, RU 486.
- F. The measure of a nation can be determined by how the helpless are valued.
- G. (Revelation 21:8).

III. Sexual Sins

- A. (1 John 2:16).
- B. Homosexuality (Romans 1:26-27), fornication (1 Corinthians 6:9-10), adultery (Galatians 5:19), immodesty (2 Timothy 2:22), dancing (Galatians 5:21), television & movies, music, (Philippians 4:6), etc...
- C. (Matthew 5:8; Hebrews 12:14).

2. We cannot allow ourselves to be poisoned by imbibing in small habitual doses.
